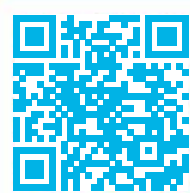

Message: Deliver Us From the Evil One: Awakened Warriors

Text: Matthew 6:13; Romans 13:11-14

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."
Matthew 6:13

"¹¹Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. ¹²The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. ¹³Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires."
Romans 13:11-14

1. Wake up from your sleep/slumber!

"It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High; ²to declare your steadfast love in the morning, and your faithfulness by night."

2. (Because) salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed (v. 11b); the night is far gone; the day is at hand (v. 12a).

3. (So then) let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light (v. 12b).

"But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. ⁹For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ," 1 Thessalonians 5:8-9

"Don't let yourself slip into believing that growing older will magically confer you some gift of godliness. Who you are now-or who you are becoming now-is a pretty good predictor of who you will someday be. If you want to be godly then, you have to learn to be godly now. This is true for young men and women as they ponder marriage and parenthood; this is true of middle age men and women as they ponder retirement and old age."

4. (So that we can) walk properly as in the daytime.

Not in carousing (excessive feasting and drunkenness)
Not in sexual immorality and sensuality
Not in quarreling and jealousy

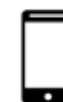
5. (To bring this argument to glorious fruition) put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the flesh in order to gratify its desires (v.14).

1. Wake up!
2. Opportunities exist.
3. Eternity awaits.
4. We fight the squirt gun stream of evil pleasure with the Niagara Falls of God's wonder in Christ.

QUESTIONS:

1. Do you think our "sleep walking" is more likely today than it was 20 years or 50 years ago? Why?
2. Has our concept of death changed with our understanding of eternity which defines the aspects of our culture?
3. Do you see the pattern of v.13 that would move from that which we do (excessive feasting and drunkenness) → the self focus (sexual immorality and sensuality) → relational breakdown (quarreling and jealousy)?
4. What is the "cut flower" generation? How do we develop a true rooted system?

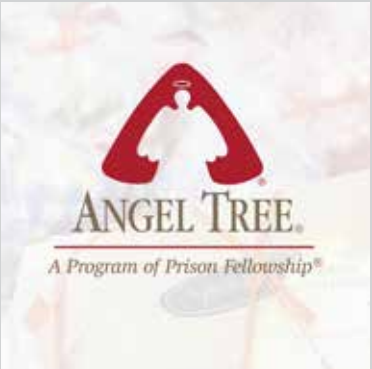
