## Sermon.

Message: Holy Warfare
Text: 1 Peter 2:11-12

1 Peter 2:11-12

"Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation."

Peter has just closed a major section of his epistle, which deals with understanding and rejoicing in the mercies of the triune God (1 Peter 1:1-2:10).

In this section, he makes application regarding this argument (1 Peter 2:11-4:11).

Regarding the tender mercies of Christ: we must continuously taste the goodness of the Lord which involves the "at one time ... but now" understanding of our salvation/ standing in Christ (1 Peter 2:10, Ephesians 2:3-5, Colossians 1:21-23).

How Do We Fight Against That Which Wages War Against Our Soul?

1. We must continuously taste the goodness and beauty of the Lord, as we long for the pure milk of the Word.

"It comes the very moment you wake up each morning. All your wishes and hopes for the day rush at you like wild animals. And the first job each morning consists simply in shoving them all back; in listening to that other voice, taking that other point of view, letting that other larger, stronger, quieter life come flowing in. And so on, all day. Standing back from all your natural fussings and frettings; coming in out of the wind."

CS Lewis, Mere Christianity

"The principal hinge on which faith turns is this: We must not suppose that any promises of mercy which the Lord offers are only true out of us, and not at all in us: We should rather make them ours by inwardly embracing them...He alone is truly a believer who, convinced by a firm conviction that God is a kindly, and well-disposed Father toward him, promises himself all things on the basis of His generosity; who, relying upon the promises of divine benevolence (love) towards him, lays hold on the undoubted expectation of salvation."

John Calvin, Institutes of the Christian Religion, 3-2-16

2. We must understand that this warfare is ongoing/constant/perpetual/unbroken.

"Some were fools through their sinful ways, and because of their iniquities suffered affliction; they loathed any kind of food, and they drew near to the gates of death. Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. He sent out his

word and healed them, and delivered them from their destruction. Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of man! And let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving, and tell of his deeds in songs of joy!" Psalm 107:17-22

3. We must understand the battleground.

"Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world—the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life—is not from the Father but is from the world. And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever." 1 John 2:15-17

- 4. We must be keenly aware of the strategy of the adversary.
  - Twists honorable conduct into accusations of evildoing/criminality.
  - Maligns/disrespects/slanders your character when you embrace biblical obedience. (1 Peter 4:4)
- 5. The wonderful hope/prospect; "Glorify God on the day he visits them with 'salvation' eyes to see the mercy of the cross."

### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Why is it good that Peter used the word "tasted"? How does this give a different aspect to Paul's statement in Romans 12:1-2?
- What is the biblical balance regarding experience and knowledge? Why are first-person singular personal pronouns (I, me, my, mine) important in growing our faith?
- . What part of the day did CS Lewis believe was absolutely essential in ordering our affections and our day (see quote above)?
- 4. Why is there a reluctance over the quote by George Mueller regarding, "There came a day when I..."?
- 5. What is the cycle spelled out in Psalm 107:17-23?
- 6. What is the battleground of faith? (1 John 1:15-17)
- What is the glorious truth of 1 Peter 2;12b, that gives sustaining power to daily living and prayer?


What is "Your 3"? This evangelism emphasis asks believers to pray for and focus on three individuals in the hope that these people may come to Christ.
