in Kingdom Living

lude 1-4 Text:

"Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and brother of James, To those who are called, beloved in God the Father and kept for Jesus Christ: <sup>2</sup>May mercy, peace, and love be multiplied to you. <sup>3</sup>Beloved, although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints. 4For certain people have crept in unnoticed who long ago were designated for this condemnation, ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our God into sensuality and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ." Jude 1-4

If we must continually understand the riches of Christ and our union with him before entering into "hard tasks" or dealing with "difficult things."

#### Preparation:

- 1. The focal point of being a servant of Jesus Christ
- 2. Finding gladness in the wonder of electing love (1 Corinthians 1:2, 9:22-24)

"Effectual calling is an act of God the Father, speaking through the human proclamation of the gospel in which he summons people to himself in such a way that they respond in saving faith." Wayne Grudem, Systematic Theology, p. 63

#### Calling Involves:

- 1. Understanding the facts of the gospel (the brokenness/sinfulness of all people, the fact that sin leads to death and separation from God, Christ paid for our sins by being our substitute.)
- 2. An invitation and the calling to respond to the good news of Christ (Matthew 11:28-30, John 1:12, Revelation 22:17)

The joy of forgiveness and eternal life by faith alone through the work of Christ alone.

- The wonder of our salvation includes being eternally loved by the Father and kept by the tender mercies of Jesus.
- 3. Mercy, peace, and love MULTIPLIED, not merely added on. Being multiplied, which means being bestowed continually and in abundance.
- Mercy: God's compassion and kindness given to us by the mercy of the cross. Those who experience mercy, extend mercy. (Jude 22-23)

• Peace: A total well-being. The way things are meant to be.
